- Low Interest Loans: The EVA has partnered with a credit union to offer members low-interest loans on electric vehicles, solar, and electric bikes.
- Battery Health Reports from Recurrent Auto: The EVA is working with Recurrent to better understand battery degradation and range loss, particularly for used electric cars. Contribute to this initiative by signing up for free monthly battery reports to share anonymous battery data. For each new EV, Recurrent is donating \$10 to the EVA so we can expand and enhance our programming.
- BlueDot: EVA members are eligible for \$10 off your first charge + \$0.30/kWh charging all time on the Bluedot network. Contact <u>membership@myeva.org</u> and ask for the bluedot code!
- Neocharge: \$125 off NeoCharge Smart Splitter. Contact <u>membership@myeva.org</u> and ask for the NeoCharge code!
- Networking Opportunities: Networking with EV advocates at events is just one of the many benefits of becoming a member. Join one of our committees to use your skills to make an impact.
- Educational Opportunities: The EVA offers ongoing virtual meetings, resources, and more including our EV Educate Certificate Program and EV blog.
