Utility Sponsors Student EV Video Contest


Cash Prizes Awarded!

The Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) held a middle school video competition, "Charge Up Change!" to encourage young people to research and learn about electric transportation. This contest challenged students to create a short video that is less than two minutes to demonstrate why electric vehicles are cool.

Across the country the coronavirus is forcing EV activists to cancel EV showcases and test drive events, leaving them stymied on driving EV adoption forward. At the same time families educating students at home are seeking interesting and energizing activities. One option for EV enthusiasts looking for alternative formats to engage their communities is to create contests that excite community youth to create videos, presentations, articles, or papers.

This first-time competition kicked off in August 2019 and was promoted to middle schools in Sacramento County. Students submitted twenty-six videos and every student who submitted a video received a family pass to visit the


