Sacramento City & County Climate Action Plans

In 2020, the Sacramento County Supervisors adopted a Climate Emergency Declaration with a target of achieving carbon neutrality by 2030. On Tuesday, July 11, they will consider delaying that date by 15 years to 2045. Peter Mackin as part of 350 submitted comments here.

Both Sacramento County and Sacramento City have released Climate Action Plans (CAPs) that describe how Sacramento will eliminate climate-changing greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions. Since the most significant contributor to GHGs is vehicles, our regional transition to EVs is vital. We're looking for volunteers to review and comment on these plans. If you'd like to be part of saving our climate, join our team to help the city and county develop the best possible plans. Just reply to this message with "I'd like to help."

•Battery Health Reports from Recurrent Auto: The EVA is working with Recurrent to better understand battery degradation and range loss, particularly for

used electric cars. Contribute to this initiative by signing up for free monthly battery reports to share anonymous battery data. For each new EV, Recurrent is donating \$10 to the EVA so we can expand and enhance our programming.

- **BlueDot:** EVA members are eligible for \$10 off your first charge + \$0.30/kWh charging all time on the Bluedot network. Contact membership@myeva.org and ask for the bluedot code!
- Neocharge: \$125 off NeoCharge Smart Splitter. Contact <u>membership@myeva.org</u> and ask for the NeoCharge code!
- Networking Opportunities: Networking with EV advocates at events is just one of the many benefits of becoming a member. Join one of our committees to use your skills to make an impact.
- **Educational Opportunities:** The EVA offers ongoing virtual meetings, resources, and more including our EV Educate Certificate Program and EV blog.
- **Benefits to SacEV**: SacEV receives a portion of your membership fee to help fund the work you do in our community.
